

1. JESUS' MAIN POINT (1) Luke 18:1 Then Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up.

- Jesus gives us the interpretation and application in advance.
- The clear message is: Keep praying—don't quit

• This was a big deal to the early church and to the persecuted church today.

• Why would Jesus teach this before his disciples are even schooled in prayer?

- There are times coming when we will somehow fail:
- By praying we are believing and hanging in there:

• As believers we shy away from effort, not wanting to "earn" God's grace. But, prayer is grace already. Asking (begging) is far from earning.

- Prayer is being response-able to grace and alligning our wills with God's. It is our job description as Image Bearers & Ruling to prayer.
- When we keep praying it's the proof of the pudding—that we believe.
- Jesus is clearnly teaching us the importance of our prayers!

2. JESUS' PARABLE (18:2-5) *"In a certain town there was a judge who neither feared God nor cared what people thought. And there was a widow in that town who kept coming to him with the plea, 'Grant me justice against my adversary.' Luke 18:4 "For some time he refused. But finally he said to himself, 'Even though I don't fear God or care what people think, ^s yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will see that she gets justice, so that she won't eventually come and attack me!'"*

• This is classic Jesus' style teaching—he's the king of hyperbole—exageration to make a point (Mat 5:29; 6:3; 7:3; Mar 10:**25;** Luk 14:26).

- In this case, even though the judge was evil and the worst possible judge we could every imagine. . .
- And even though the Widow—the lowest power in society . . .

- The widow persisted and prevailed
- Jesus' point is—in worst case scenarios and prayer wins

3. GOD WILL ANSWER QUICKLY (18:6-8a) *Luke 18:6 And the "Listen to what the unjust judge says." And will not God bring about justice for his chosen ones, who cry out to him day and night? Will he keep putting them off? "I tell you, he will see that they get justice, and quickly.*

- If the scum of the earth (unjust judge) eventually answers... (Contrary to the hyperbole, God is not like a wicked, selfish judge).
- Will not a perfect God (wants his goodness (will) to come to earth) answer those who persist in prayer?
- Answer will come quickly. Daniel 9:23, "as soon as you began praying. . ."

4. TRUE FAITH CONTINUES TO PRAY (18:8b) *However, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on the earth?"*

- Our faith is what is at stake; it is the catalyst the life line.
- Jesus will find faith if we are praying. If we believe we will pray.
- Persistent prayer is the exercise of faith in a good and loving God.

• True faith scans the greatness and goodness of God & matches it with the neediness of humankind.

- God scans our faith.
