## Read James 2:1-13

- Confirm out serious the Bible takes favoritism/partiality by looking at a few references: Leviticus 19:15; Malachi 2:9; Proverbs 22:2; Matthew 7:1; Acts 10:34-35; Galatians 3:26-28.
- Discuss some ways you might be tempted to show favoritism at work, at church, at home, even in small groups.
- Share how you've been discriminated against and how you've handled it.
- How do you suppose followers of Jesus can reflect His image and show no favoritism?
- What does it mean to you personally, to put the Royal Law into practice (*Love your neighbor as yourself*)? (See Leviticus 19:18; Matthew 22:39)
- What is your perspective on one's attitude and motives as it pertains to verse 10? (See Matthew 5:22, 28)
- Why do you think favoritism a spiritual matter or a sin issue?
- Describe what it means to you to speak & act as believers? (v.12)
- How do you envision faith and mercy working in and through your life?
