18 Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.
19 Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Matthew 28:16-20

The Power of Disciple Making – 11 People to change the world

- When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted Matthew 28:17
 - o They wavered in their thinking
 - The trauma of disappointment
 - What you have for us, is better than what I can have more myself
 - o The weight of responsibility for these Disciples
 - Jesus isn't leading the "Ministry" any more
 - The Disciples are a little lost and aimless
 - John 21:3 Peter told them, <u>"I'm going fishing."</u> And they all replied, "We'll go with you." So they went out and fished through the night, but caught nothing.
 - Jesus has confidently planned for these 11 Disciples to Change the world
 - Atonement without messengers isn't effective
 - Having the cure to cancer and not giving it away
 - Why is Disciple Making so important
 - The Penny problem

What does Disciple Making look like.

- Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given
 - to me. 19 Therefore go and make disciples of all nations Matthew 28:18-19
 - Imitate me as I imitate Christ 1 CORINTHIANS 11:1
 - In Disciple Making, we aren't replicating ourselves, we aim to replicate Christ through our lives – pointing to his authority, not our own
- Disciple Making is rooted in relationship
 - The Spectrum of Discipleship
 - Discipline and Disciple share the same linguistic root
 - We live in a culture where there is abundance of content but a lack of connectedness



Becoming a Disciple-Making Culture

- Programs in the church can providing great content and understanding of spiritual disciplines
 - True Discipleship is disciplines working through relationship
- To be an effective disciple maker, foster relationships where the spiritual disciplines embodied in your life are visible and replicable for others to follow.
 - Discipleship isn't accomplished when you do ministry, its fulfilled when you bring someone to walk alongside you as you do that ministry
 - Lets Shift our church into a culture of Disciple Makers
 - Disciple Making is focused on Lives forming other lives
 - People didn't just study text, they examined someone's LIFE
 - To be a disciple means to study and learn a Christ filled lifestyle

Making the shift towards a culture of Disciple Making

- And teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you Matthew 28:20
 - $\circ \quad \text{Discipleship is spelt OBEY}-\text{Nic Gilmour}$
- Lets start with parents
 - Parents are living with relentless pressure of their lives being an example
 - Parents are the main disciplers of their kids
 - Youth Groups and Christian schools are not enough to Disciple your Children
 - You have the largest influence in discipleship in your kids life
 - True disciples make disciples
 - Steward and environment where kids feel safe to learn, and have the responsibility to teach others
 - Your kids will make mistakes
 - \circ $\;$ You need to empower them through Trust
 - Model for our kids what it looks like to be a student (Be discipled yourself)
 - Create an environment for your kids to learn
 - Be Spiritually Intentional in your home

 - Lets model to our kids a posture of being a student
 - How do we foster a culture of Discipleship in our home?

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- model for our kids what it looks like to be a student
- If you have been walking in the faith, you are ready to start discipling
 - GO MAKE DISCIPLES The responsibility is yours, not theirs
 - A disciple maker is not a perfect person
 - Peter still made plenty of mistakes
 - You are not replicating yourself, you are pointing towards a relationship with Jesus, you point towards his authority
 - You remind yourself and your disciples of the grace of Jesus
 - You hold people accountable to a lifestyle of learning
 - You model for others what a life of faith looks like
 - You teach them how to pray, how to love, how to deny yourself
 - You teach them to obey, everything Jesus taught
 - John 14:26 But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you.
 - o If you are busy in ministry, start being intentional about disciple making
 - Look to foster relationships where the spiritual disciplines embodied in your life are visible and replicable for others to follow.
 - A lot of our spiritual life is personal, doesn't happen in public, we need to invite people we disciple to witness that.
 - Get creative, look for opportunities
 - Communicate with intentionality your desire to disciple
 - Disciple disciples that make disciples
 - o If you are new to the faith, seek out someone to disciple you.
 - Ask for intentionality, don't just sign up for a program
 - Sometimes our availability dictates our transformation
 - Is Christ inviting you to leave everything and come and follow him?
