

God's Faithfulness in Our Failures

> ABRAM'S TESTING: "Now there was a famine in the land..." (Gen. 12:10)

- "Sometimes It Can Seem Like It's Never Easy"
- In life-tests we discover what really counts
- Clear tests in life have already occurred in Genesis
- Brief overview on spiritual principles regarding trials/testing

> ABRAM'S FAILURE: "Abram went down to Egypt to live there.." (Gen.12:10)

- We Live in a rational and natural and supernatural world. Discerning what is natural in a fallen world and what is from God or evil is difficult.
- But what was Abram's motive? Where was his trust?
- Issue: God's promise of land & seed
- Lesson: blessing comes from God, not the land or Abram's effort
- Testing Abram's Heart---He fails
- Doubt is a real thing
- This increased his sin by accepting gifts
- He had to return to the famine & face it anyway. What you run from now you will face later.

➢ GOD'S FAITHFULNESS : "But the LORD . . ." (Gen. 12:17-20)

- "But God. . . ": 2 of best words in scripture, especially in Abram's life
- Primary teaching here is God's faithfulness in spite of Abram's foolishness and threat of hunger, fear, and greed God intervenes, protects, and restores.
- The words in the passage speak loudly
- Does not mean you're invincible, but God does intervene (Rom 8:28).

> ABRAM RETURNS TO BETHEL: "So Abram went up from Egypt..." (Gen. 13:1)

- When you lose the trail you return to last marker: *until he came to Bethel,...* where his tent had been earlier
- Notice there is no talk of worship in Egypt. He returned to where he had first built an altar. There Abram called on the name of the LORD.
